
Preceding the dinner was the quarterly Board of Directors meeting. The

The New CLE 53

AMG Performance in a Coupe Chassis

If the Mercedes-Benz® AMG CLE nameplate isn't ringing a bell for you, that's because it's a fairly new model. Shedding the former E-Class coupe and C-Class coupe, Mercedes-Benz decided to merge the

two models into one earlier this year. Now known as the CLE coupe, the streamlined design pairs C-Class looks with E-Class proportions. Mercedes-AMG is sharpening its product portfolio and redefining the entry performance coupe segment with the new

AMG CLE 53 Coupe.

Based on the already revealed CLE coupe chassis, the AMG version is naturally more about what's under the hood than its exterior presence. However, the body of the 2024 Mercedes-AMG CLE 53 coupe is widened compared to its non-AMG siblings. The sporty two-door model combines the best of two worlds, the agility and sportiness of the AMG C-Class with the interior space and elegance of the AMG E-Class.

The interior welcomes passengers with unique equipment, exclusive materials and the latest generation MBUX infotainment system. In each door, a strip of light runs along the contour lines of the armrest and the beltline to the rear seats. Another highlight is the sporty integral seats designed to pro-

vide excellent lateral support. Customers can also choose from several optional leather upholsteries, along with Nappa leather upholstery featuring an embossed AMG crest in the front headrests.

The new CLE 53 uses a comprehensively upgraded, AMG-enhanced M256M 3.0-liter inline six-cylinder turbocharged engine. The improved electric auxiliary compressor can now be operated almost continuously over a

longer period of time to provide higher torque at a wider range of engine speeds and enhance overall responsiveness of the engine. In addition, this allows for a larger exhaust gas tur-

bocharger to be fitted for higher peak performance.

The AMG-enhanced engine is coupled with an AMG SPEEDSHIFT® TCT 9G transmission, which impresses with short shift times, quick response, double-declutching function, and multiple downshifts. Transmission calibration is tailored for a variety of driving situations, such as dynamic acceleration or efficiency, depending on the drive program selected.

Developed in Affalterbach, the CLE 53 Coupe is equipped with AMG RIDE CONTROL suspension designed for handling agility, more neutral cornering, and greater traction. The steel spring suspension features particularly sporty damper tuning and adaptive adjustable damping, combining excellent driving dynamics with a high level of ride comfort. The steering layout also contributes to the



increase in dynamics and comfort. The CLE 53 Coupe has three-stage AMG parameter steering that adapts to the selected AMG DYNAMIC SELECT drive program. When maneuvering at low speeds and parking, little steering effort is required. Steering power assistance decreases at higher speeds.

The car is still an AMG and will be well-tuned for dynamic driving. Mercedes-AMG has yet to say just how much the 2024 CLE 53 coupe will cost, and it didn't set a delivery timeline either. Regardless of its likely high price tag, it's clear that AMG has been mindful of how it incorporates the CLE nameplate.



Ceramic Coatings

Protecting Your Prized Possession

Undeniably, protecting the appearance of your car is one of the most important aspects of owning a vehicle. Whether you're investing in every detail being clean and tidy, or more concerned with overall wear and tear, every car owner wants the best for their vehicle. For many luxury car owners, including Mercedes®-Benz enthusiasts, a ceramic coating is a worthwhile investment. Recently, one of our members mentioned that they had this done, and they believed it made their three-year-old car's paint look brighter and shinier.

On every car, there is a primer, a base coat of paint, and a clear coat that protects the paint from external elements. A ceramic coating is an option that can be applied on top of the clear coat to add enhanced protection. This technology is primarily formulated of silicon dioxide, although others can include titanium dioxide, which increases the coat's protective qualities and longevity. When evaluating and comparing

different ceramic coatings brands, the main difference is going to be the amount of silicon dioxide that is in the formula.

What makes this technology work so well is the existence of tiny particles that form a very thin and transparent layer

that is undetectable to the naked eye. It seals to your car's paint and is resistant to harmful UV rays, scratches, chemicals, and heat. Since this nanotechnology seals and attaches to the paint, it will not break down over a short period of time.

There are other less-expensive options, including waxes and sealants. Wax is the most affordable option and can be purchased in a spray or paste form. For decades, waxes have been used to keep cars looking shiny and new. When it comes to protecting the car, however, a wax isn't going to do that much. Many of us wax our cars, because that is what we were taught to do. Even if a wax is applied several times a year, environmental forces and soap can break it down pretty quickly. A sealant is a silica-based polymer that is applied by hand and cures to form a protective layer. This synthetic option can last for years, yet still is outmatched by a ceramic coating.

Essentially acting as a hard shell on the vehicle, a ceramic coating can prevent water stains, road grime, and other sub-

stances from touching and harming the paint. A quick rinse of water makes every foreign object, including bird poop, slide easily off. The ceramic coating creates a hydrophobic layer that repels water, meaning mineral deposits and dirt

do not have an opportunity to hurt the surface of the car's paint.

For people who live in areas that get lots of ice and snow, like the Sierra Nevada region, a ceramic coating can do wonders. Ice and snow will not stick to the surface of your car because of the hydrophobic properties of the coating. UV rays cause paint to oxidize, so vehicle owners in sunny climates are susceptible to losing the luster on their car. A ceramic coating can prevent paint from fading, dulling, and deteriorating.

Unlike wax, a ceramic coating is not a technology that can be removed and reapplied. Instead, it adheres to and bonds with the car's paint, similar to staining a piece of wood. Because of this permanence, an experienced professional should install a ceramic coating to ensure a smooth, uniform result. If for some reason a mistake is made, such as a bubble or piece of trapped dirt, the entire area of the car must be sanded and the coating reapplied. Because of this level of detail required, an expert might charge a hefty installation fee for a seemingly inexpensive product. While a ceramic coating kit may run a few hundred dollars, an installer can charge well over \$1,000 to lay it on a vehicle.

A ceramic coating is a great option for someone wishing to keep their car shiny and new, but it won't protect against everything. Shopping carts will still dent, car doors will still scratch, and rogue rocks will still chip. While it's not an impenetrable layer, it is still a worthwhile investment. Additionally, a ceramic coating may not require reapplications like a wax coating will, but it does require frequent brush-free car washes. An occasional treatment spray, which can be done at home, can also help keep the coating looking fresh and shiny. A good ceramic coating that is installed professionally can last several years.



Mercedes-Benz® recently showed off their Mercedes EQG off-roading vehicle at the Consumer Electronics Show (CES)® 2024, held at the Venetian in Las Vegas, Nevada. The EQG comes equipped with a new feature that allows the cars to spin on a perfect 360 degrees. In a previous issue of the *Silver Star*, we covered a similar video where the EQG spun in the sand. This time, the spins seem much smoother, featured on the Las Vegas strip as four of the cars turn in unison.
