#### The Mustang – My 3<sup>rd</sup> car

Over the last few months I've been writing about the experience of getting my first car and the ones that came after. I had a lot to learn about car ownership, the maintenance involved, and the cars ahead in my future.

So after my 1<sup>st</sup> car, the '59 Ford Galaxie 500, and after selling the '62 Olds and getting \$900 for it, I was on the hunt for my next car. When Ford unveiled the 1965 Mustang; I was hooked right away. That was the car for me. Of course \$900 was not going to get me a Mustang. I was still in high school. But the hunt was on for a used Mustang that I could possibly afford. Not long after the sale of the Olds, I lost my dad... and I drove his '61 Comet to school and work for a while longer.

I still had years to go before I discovered Mercedes-Benz and what

it was like to drive and own one. At this time in my life, a Mercedes-Benz was only a distant and passing dream.

But Mustangs were running through my head now – back then car ads were in the newspaper, and there were lots of ads. Used '65 mustangs were priced between \$1400 and \$1900 depending on options, mileage and condition.

During my junior year in high school, I got a part time job at the San Antonio Light newspaper company working in the advertising production department. It was an interesting job that paid well for a high school kid.

- called C&D Motors. I knew this had to be the place since those letters are my initials. I drove to the car lot and there it was - a burgundy 1965 Mustang coupe with white interior. It had a 289 V8, and a 3 speed standard floor shift. It had no A/C, no center console, but was in overall good condition. It had 58k miles on the odometer. A bit high for a 3 year old car. But it didn't have many options; it was priced well at \$1000 - Cash only. Plus TT&L. I was excited - but I still needed a little more money - now that I had a better paying job, I knew I could do this... so that weekend I took my mom to see the car. I needed to get her approval. She always liked cool cars, so it wasn't hard to get her okay. She liked the car. So the deal was done, and I drove home in the Mustang.

A neighborhood auto service center had a special going on – for \$250 installed. It even included a larger radiator fan to help cool the engine with the added pull of the compressor. What a deal... I loved that car. I kept it through my high school graduation. Then I was ready for a newer car. Cars number 3 and 4 were next. Car number 3 was a short term – until number 4 came along. I'll elaborate on that story next time. Until then, enjoy your ride – whatever it may be.





**December 7th**—Holiday Dinner Party at Stone Werks on 1604 and Blanco in the Vineyard Shopping Center. More on this will come to your inbox.




