Club Enjoys Fine Dining at The Grill at Quail Corners

he Grill at Quail Corners has an interesting and storied past as a well beloved staple for fine dining in Reno. In 1850, Eli Francovich migrated to California from Yugoslavia in search of gold, and eventually settled in Reno. In Nevada, Francovich established The Wine House, one of the state's first restaurants and bars, and also Nevada's first multi-story casino. The Wine House operated continuously for 87 years until the fourth generation of the Francovich family closed it to pursue other interests. The family has continued to produce its famous spirits, which include

Francovich Holiday Nog and the Francovich Manhattan, available online and in local grocery and liquor stores. In 1999, fifth-generation Sam Francovich opened The Grill at Quail Corners and returned the family to its restaurant and bar roots. Last year, Sam sold The Grill to one of his employees who had been a waitress and manager at The Grill for more than seven years, trusting her to continue the legacy of quality that his family had started.

In early August, the Sierra Nevada Section of the Mercedes-Benz® Club of America kicked off the month with a return to this delicious restaurant for their

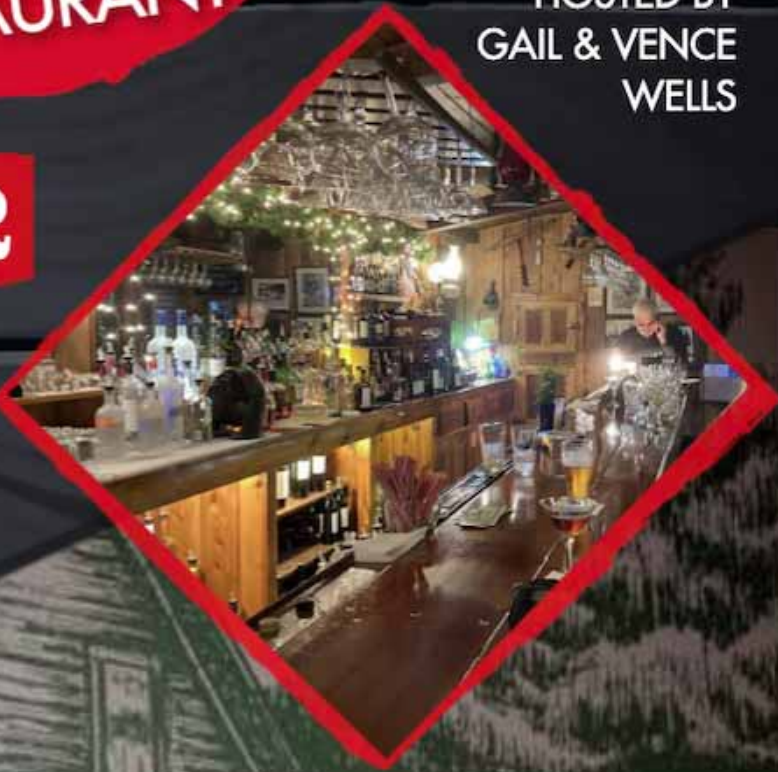

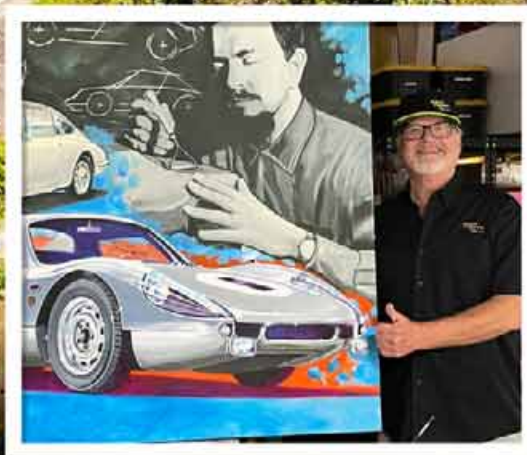

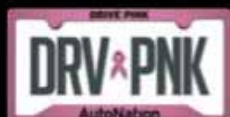

Gas Powered Mercedes Set to Stick Around

While many Mercedes-Benz® customers had been increasingly concerned about the company's future potentially going completely into electric and hybrid vehicles, there is no need for worry. It has been revealed that the up-

coming next-generation AMG CLE63 Coupe is set to stick with the brand's V8 engine rather than swap to the Formula 1 inspired hybrid powertrain in the closely related C63 sedan and new GLC63 SUV.

While not officially confirmed, the upcoming CLE63, which will join the

recently launched CLE Coupe and Cabriolet range sometime in 2025, will be powered by an updated version of the 4.0-liter twin-turbo V8 from the previous C63 Coupe and other models in the AMG range, such as the new GT Coupe. While less powerful than the

500kW/1020Nm 2.0-liter four-cylinder turbocharged hybrid powertrain in the C63 sedan, it's believed AMG is responding to the softer than expected acceptance of a downsized AMG powertrain.

Mercedes-Benz Australia's head of media relations, Jerry Stamoulis, told us that while the new F1-inspired hybrid set-up still has a big future for AMG, retaining the V8 was a priority and that's why it's still available across the GT, GT

4-Door, and others.

"With AMG technology, let's call it, when we went from V8 to supercharged, supercharged to turbo, every time there was concern," he said. "The

difference is now, if you want a V8, we have other models with V8s. We've got more to come. V8 is still part of our portfolio. So there are still options. If you really want a V8 AMG, we have one."

Rumor has it the CLE63 was supposed to have a plug-in hybrid setup based around a smaller 2.0-liter four-cylinder engine, just like in the C63.

While there is no confirmation on why this might have changed, it is good to see Mercedes-Benz listening to the concerns of their customers and keeping the gas powered V8 engine in their plans. Despite the supposed powertrain change late in the development phase, the CLE63 is still on track to premiere before the end of 2024. It should come in both coupe and convertible

body styles.

The jury is still out on what will power the next-generation E63. However, about a year ago, AMG CEO Michael Schiebe said it wouldn't have a V-8. A plug-in hybrid inline-six or something to that effect would likely bring a power advantage over the CLE63. That said, having a smaller gas engine will be a turnoff for some buyers.

Charging Up

Mercedes Making Moves to Provide Energy with Coffee

West Coast coffee lovers will soon get a jolt of a different kind, as Mercedes-Benz® is partnering with Starbucks® to build electric vehicle charging stations outside its stores.

The Seattle-based java giant and Mercedes-Benz High-Power Charging (MBHPC) will install hundreds of fast chargers at 100 Starbucks near Interstate 5, according to *Electrek*, an electric vehicle focused news site. The highway runs south from the Canadian border outside of Vancouver through Washington, Oregon, and California and into Mexico near Tijuana. There will be four to ten DC chargers of up to 400 kilowatts at each coffee shop. They will accommodate all EVs but won't

come online until 2025. The chargers will be fitted for NACS and CCS connections, as well as 800-volt batteries.

"This sort of advancement is exactly what we need in the industry," said Carleen Cullen, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Cool the Earth, an independent nonprofit focused on reducing carbon emissions through electric vehicles. "Putting chargers where people shop and eat is the perfect solution."

MBHPC is investing one billion dollars in its network, which opened in November with a station at its Sandy Springs, Georgia, headquarters. There are now 12 locations in Georgia, South Carolina, Florida, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, and Texas. They are all powered by 100% clean energy. The net-

work over the next 12 to 18 months will expand to almost half of the United States, Electrek reported. EV charging station producers MN8 Energy, ChargePoint®, and Alpitronic® are also involved in the project.

EVs are touted for their ability to help lower pollution in our warming world, but their widespread adoption has been slowed by concerns such as range anxiety, which refers to the distances they can travel before their batteries are exhausted. Without ubiquitous charging stations, EV drivers won't have the peace of mind that drivers of gas-guzzlers do.

Charging stations have also been beset by functionality problems, overcrowding, and vandalism. With the

you already visit regularly. Compared to a sit-down restaurant that takes too long or gas station that nobody wants to spend 15-20 minutes at, this is a great opportunity to charge your vehicle." ☸
