Wishing you all a happy & healthy 2025. See you next year!



As we say goodbye to 2024, our first event of the new year will be our annual Members Meeting on Saturday, January 25th, at Martin's Bar-B-Que Joint.






Sophia Loren (1934-...), the Italian actress, owned a silver Mercedes-Benz 300SL Gullwing, a gift from her husband in 1955, film producer Carlo Ponti. She was frequently photographed with it during the height of her career in the 1950s. Loren wasn't just a passive owner-she drove the 300SL in prestigious events, including the Mille Miglia and the Rallye del Cinema, an exclusive Italian rally where film stars and directors showcased their cars.

There was a chemistry between her and the Benz. They both had class, they both had style. Her Gullwing also placed her in elite company alongside other celebrity owners like Pablo Picasso, Evis Presley and Clark Gable.

Years later, the car was rediscovered by HK Engineering, a renowned specialist in 300SL restorations, who carefully restored the Gullwing to its original condition, preventing its history and connection to Loren.



David A. Rosenberg, 72, beloved grandfather, brother, husband, and friend to many, died peacefully on October 18, 2024 after his battle with cancer. David was born April 18, 1952 to parents Samuel and Lucille (Berman) of Louisville.

He was preceded in death by his parents and his sister, Judy Lehocky (Ron). He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Martha (Gatz), son Aaron (Emily), grandsons Abram and Miles, sister Cheryl Streedain (Dick), and several cousins, nieces, and nephews.

David attended Belknap Elementary School, Highland Junior High School, Atherton High School class of 1971, and graduated from Bellarmine in 1977.

He was a lifetime member of Lakeside Swim Club, member of Temple Shalom since its inception, belonged to the Louisville British Sports Car Club, Mercedes-Benz of America Bluegrass Stars Chapter, Evolve Kentucky, and the Louisville Photographic Society. David also volunteered time with the Who Dunnit Murder Mystery Theater group.

Anyone who met David knows his heart was kind, getting hugs were the best part of his day, and his sense of humor was hard to match. He will be missed dearly.
