
Coming up, I'd like to spotlight a couple of events:



Entry to the Car Show opens at 8am. Getting to McPherson College is pretty straight forward, the school is off of US 56W in McPherson, Kansas. When entering the school grounds, follow signs to the show participant entry point. At the entry point you will be directed to the MBCA area. During the show you will have an opportunity to wander all over the show grounds. McPherson College is one of the few colleges with a 4-year degreed program in auto restoration. During the day you can take an opportunity to tour the restoration area and classrooms. Throughout the day there will be live music, refreshments, and some special highlighted cars. The show wraps just after 2pm.



The Wild and Wacky World of Exotic Cars

As the New Year's winter turns into spring, we have another new season of auctions and new car introductions by the various manufacturers. While the stock market is down, and the economy is dealing with inflation worries, never fear as the exotic car market marches on with ever increasing prices. Prices at the large auctions are going up as well.

The Mecum Kissimmee Auction got the year started off with a bang with a number of big money cars and bigger results. Not all sold even with large numbers such as the 1967 Jaguar E-type known as the Shaguar from the Austin Powers movies. It only bid to \$880k, which wasn't enough for Dr. Evil. A 1965 Shelby Cobra 427 bid to \$3.7 million and a no sale. The star of the show was the 1969 Porsche 917K, owned by Jerry Seinfeld, bid to \$25 million with no sale. I suppose that Jerry was just testing the market.

Some cars that did sell were the 1966 Ford GT 40 MK 1 known as the road car because it was built and sold to be driven on public roads. It brought a healthy \$7,040,000. A 1965 Shelby GT 350 went for \$990k and a 1957 Mercedes 300SL Gullwing went for \$1,485,000. You can see all the results for the sale at Mecum.com.

It is interesting to note the transition from collectors to sellers as owners age and start thinking about estate issues. There were no less than 50 different collections selling cars at the auction. The offerings varied from a few cars to larger collections. We are seeing this more and more at the auction venues, so if you are in the market for a car, now is a good time to start looking. Don't expect any cheap deals though.

Moving on to the exotic market, prices are up for all the players! Let's look at the new offerings from Aston Martin and Ferrari. Aston Martin introduced the newest version of the Vantage last year along with the DB12. The Vantage roadster is being introduced as we speak with a base price of over \$200k which jumps quickly to \$250k with options. It is easy to reach higher prices when you charge \$2,600 for carpet and \$2,650 for floor mats. But wait there's more, the Vanquish which is the range topper starts at \$432k base. It is the hotter version of the DB12. For that money you get a twin-turbo V12 making 824hp with a top speed of 214 mph. Some will say the only thing faster than the top speed of 214 mph is the rate of depreciation! Rush to your AM dealer as the order book is now open.

Not to be out done by the British, Ferrari has introduced the new 12 Cilindri which is the newest version of the 812 and 812 GTS. Base price for the coupe is \$470k with a Spyder option easily being \$550k or more. No need to rush to the dealership as they are already sold out. The 812 has been discontinued along with the SF90 and the Roma. Speaking of the SF90, both it and the 296GT/S are hybrids and are suffering from slow sales due to over pricing (in my opinion) when new and lack of interest from the public in EV cars. Ferrari dealers are sitting on a number of these cars at every dealership. While the Ferrari EV cars are very fast, the

gasoline powered cars are far more popular. I don't see that changing anytime soon.

Remember to get your cars serviced for spring and summer driving. See you next time.
